JAMES CARL, MAGICIAN.

For those Patrons who attended Eddie Dawes presentation a couple of years ago, will perhaps recall him talking about the Derby Magician, James Carl.

James, who's real name was James Wakefield, lived at 100 Chester Green Road, Derby. was born in June 1875 and died 1955 aged 79yrs.

James was a Town Councillor and performed general magic and was also a ventriloquist.

During the First world War he entertained the troops in hospital close to the front line.

One of his high lights of his career was his appearance at the Maskelyne Theatre, St Georges Hall, London.

It appears that James Carl is not a well known performer to the general public of Derby and his fame as a magician has been forgotten and lost in the realms of history of derby. However there are moves a foot to commemorate his life as a person of note in Derby by an historical plaque. If this comes about, it will be a wonderful addition to the magical history of Derby.
